Missions Month Report



As I write, Christmas is just under 90 days away. Lots of things come to mind as you think about Christmas prep—but chances are that missions isn't one of them.

For the past several years, our church has organized a missions project each December focused on supporting one of our ministry partners. However, we

believe that in the life of the church, missions shouldn't be an afterthought or a side dish—it should be the main course.

This year, our elders set aside the month of September to conduct a giving drive for all our missions partners. We were overwhelmed by your generosity. In a season of economic tumult and record-setting inflation, **you sacrificed more than \$1,500 for missions.** What's more, two-thirds went toward vital, life-saving ministries focused on the unborn and their families in York City. That doesn't even include the gifts you gave directly to missionaries, which we aren't able to track. That's 20% more than the total raised for last year's Christmas giving project, added to the \$30,000 the church already budgeted for church extension and international missions in 2022.

This is all by God's grace. On behalf of the Faith BFC York missions team and all our ministry partners: **thank you.** We praise God for your faithful financial sacrifice and prayers.

Consider Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 9:10-15:

For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God. By their approval of this service, they will glorify God because of your submission that comes from your confession of the gospel of Christ and the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others, while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God upon you. Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift!

Thanks, indeed, be to God! We also extend a special thanks to Helen Gemmill, Kathy Miller, Ken and Lorna Good, and Jorge and Jerica Mercado for their service on the missions team.

Stay tuned in the months ahead for more ways to engage the Great Commission. For now, continue to pray for our global partners and ask God how he can use you on mission.

Missionaries of the Month



This past year, 38 people groups were given something they never had before: New Testaments in their own language. This is the work of Wycliffe Bible Translators. However, they can't do this important job on their own. In today's world, they need assistance with transportation, technology, and resource management, which is where JAARS comes in.

JAARS (Jungle Aviation and Radio Service) provides logistical support for organizations involved in Bible translation. Glenn and Leah Ruth Blauser help provide this support at JAARS' North Carolina facilities, where Glenn packs and ships materials Bible translators need but can't get overseas. This may not be what you think of when you think of missions, but, as Leah Ruth says, "Although most of the people at JAARS are doing behind-the-scenes jobs like Glenn does, they are part of the link between you and the front-line ministries... God uses all of us to accomplish His work." Please pray for the Blausers as they continue this unseen but vitally important work.
